**1. Candidate for Co-President position**

**Evanthia Kasiora** is an Associate in the International Arbitration practice of White & Case based in Paris. Evanthia's practice includes international commercial and investment arbitration across a variety of industries, including energy, infrastructure and construction. Evanthia represents private companies, States and State-owned entities in international arbitration, as well as provides pre- and post-arbitration advice to clients. She also has experience as Tribunal Secretary. Prior to joining White & Case, Evanthia acquired experience in international arbitration at an international law firm in London and trained in civil and commercial litigation in Greece.

Evanthia is qualified in Greece and is registered with the Paris Bar as an EU lawyer. She holds LL.M.s from the London School of Economics (International Business Law) and the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (Civil Procedure). Evanthia participated in the Vis Moot in 2018 and has stayed actively involved as a coach and arbitrator. She also leads some of her firm's Vis Moot-related activities. Since May 2023, she was the Vice President of the MAA Executive Board and had been chairing the MAA Mentor-Mentee Programme since 2021.

Fernanda was the Chair of Events (Vienna) for the Moot Alumni Association since 2023 and was previously a Regional Representative for the MAA.
